
LINDEN POSTCARD SHOW 2022-23

Welcome to the 32nd *Linden Postcard Show*, my first as a member of the Linden New Art team.

Within a week of beginning as Director, I began watching our offices gradually fill with over 800 artworks which together comprise the entries for this year's exhibition. Inventive, brave and diverse, this mass of art caused me to reflect on my own experience with the Postcard Show. I originally visited over two decades ago hoping to grab a bargain as I began to assemble a hotch-pot of an art collection. This became an annual pilgrimage which quickly morphed from wanting to buy to wanting to explore. Many years later I had the privilege of being a judge, still exploring but this time with a specific task at hand. Now as a team member I have the pleasure of working with colleagues to continue to deliver this amazingly long-standing annual event.

What has remained consistent throughout the decades of my engagement has been










